



THE REGION

Remote - but only 80 kms from Hobart!

Rich in timber heritage ,Maydena is located in one of the most beautiful areas of Australia. It is surrounded by tall forests, rivers and national parks. To the west is the spectacular South West National Park, part of the World Heritage Area. This contains a dramatic landscape, popular with bushwalkers, the huge Pedder and Gordon lakes and the hydro town of Strathgordon.

North of the town is Tasmania's first national park – Mt Field National Park, which attracts over 100,000 visitors annually. Containing the spectacular Russell Falls and Lake Dobson, the park has been a favourite for generations of Tasmanians. Maydena is only 15 kms west of the park.

The vast forests of the Tyenna, Florentine and Styx Valleys surround the town with the Styx containing the world's tallest flowering plants, Eucalyptus regnans or Swamp Gum (Mountain Ash). There are many reserves with walking tracks that invite discovery.

The area is also rich in timber heritage with many forestry artefacts still located in the bush and living forestry history still residing in Maydena.

Hundreds of kilometres of forestry tracks exist in the area, constructed to high standards to support harvesting operations. Nearby are the beautiful Styx, Florentine and Tyenna Rivers, an angler's delight. Enthusiasts can 4WD, trail bike, mountain bike or simply walk their dog - it's all possible in State forests. The area is also renowned for its extensive cave systems.

Maydena provides the perfect base to explore this region. Within 15 minutes from your front door you can be amongst towering Swamp Gums, walking through a rainforest or have your first trout in the bag. No matter what your recreational interests, there are world-class opportunities just around the bend of the road.
