

## Notes for Contributors

*Tasforests* accepts all forestry-related articles and is not intended to be solely a forum for scientific papers. It is a means of communicating descriptive or technical information on a wide range of subjects relevant to those with an interest in Tasmanian forests. Subjects such as forest history, machinery developments, silvicultural research, nature conservation and forest ecology are all suitable.

Contributed articles can be submitted at any time and will be included in issues of the journal as space and time permit. The journal is open to contributors from any organisation as well as private individuals. All articles will be reviewed.

The article should be presented in well written English, with a minimum of jargon, and it must include an abstract of up to 200 words at the beginning.

**Initial submission of manuscripts:** Three hard copies of the article, or one electronic copy, are required. Tables and illustrations should be placed on separate pages at the end of each copy of the manuscript. Captions should be given on the same page as the table or illustration to which they refer. Authors should also keep in mind that the journal is printed in black and white so that, if an illustration requires colour to be understood clearly, then it is unsuitable and should be omitted or re-designed. Originals of figures and photos are not required until the paper is accepted.

The manuscript should be set in a single column on A4 paper, as double-spaced typescript, printed on one side of the paper. A serif font (e.g. Times, Times New Roman, Palatino) at about 10 or 12 point size is preferred for the text. Wherever possible, a sans serif typeface such as Arial or Helvetica should be used for lettering on diagrams.

**General matters regarding style:** The *Style Manual for Authors, Editors and Printers* of the Australian Government Publishing Service (published by John Wiley & Sons, Australia) is used by the editors as a general guide to style, and the *Oxford Dictionary* is used as the reference for spelling. Authors are referred to these publications and to recent issues of *Tasforests* for style conventions.

**Nomenclature:** Responsibility for the taxonomic nomenclature used for plant and animal species rests with the author(s) of each individual paper.

**References:** The format for references should follow that given in recent issues of *Tasforests*. Authors should note, in particular, that journal titles are given in full, and if there is more than one part to a volume it should be indicated. Where separately authored papers have been published together in books, reports or proceedings of conferences, the title and page numbers of the cited paper are needed as well as the title, editors, publisher and city of publication for the compiled volume. Proceedings of conferences also need the dates of the conference. The total number of pages in books or reports is not needed.

Papers that are 'in prep.' are not accepted in the reference list but are referred to in the text as 'unpublished data' or 'pers. comm.' with their source, as appropriate.

**Final manuscript:** After the article is accepted for publication, the authors will be asked to supply an electronic version of their corrected manuscript. The text (double-spaced, single column) and tables are preferred in Microsoft Word, and graphs and histograms are preferred as charts in Excel. However, there is considerable flexibility and the editors should be consulted if there are likely to be problems. If illustrations are provided as image files, a resolution of 600 dpi is needed for line drawings and 300 dpi for greyscale images. TIF, EPS or JPEG formats are suitable. If photographs are supplied, they should be high quality prints with good contrast on glossy paper.
